

Concert Etiquette

Concerts are a very important part of your child's participation in the music program. Because a concert performance can make some people nervous, there are a few things you as an audience can do to make our concerts less stressful and more enjoyable for everyone.

- 1. Please be seated before the starting time of the concert.
- 2. If you are bringing small children, please stress the importance of being quiet while the music is being performed.
- 3. If you must leave for any reason, please do so between musical selections. Please re-enter between selections as well.
- 4. If you have a small child who will not stop crying or can't sit still, please take him or her out of the performance room quickly and quietly.
- 5. Please avoid taking photos during the performance. The flash can cause a problem with reading the music or following the conductor.
- 6. Please do not talk during the performance. Others may want to hear the music. It may be their child's "big part".
- 7. Please do not call out your child's name before, during or after the group's performance.
- 8. Please silence all cell phones before the performance begins.


Program Notes

Loest - Slide Hero

Slide Hero represents the first publication from Fanfare Music Press. With just four notes in Concert Bb major, Slide Hero bridges the gap between early method book exercises and very beginning band music. This work features the slide trombonists!

Hannickel - Popcorn Prelude

A concert band is made up of several different sections, such as the FLUTES, the OBOES, the CLARINETS, the TRUMPETS, the HORNS, the TROMBONES, the BARITONES, the TUBAS, and the PERCUSSION. To help the audience become more familiar with the appearance and sound of each type of instrument, Popcorn Prelude features each of these sections in turn. The flute, oboes, and mallet percussion instruments are one group. The trumpets and horns are another. The trombones, baritones, and tuba make up the low brass section. The snare drum and bass drum provide the drum breaks between melodic sections along with the crash cymbals punctuating the music!




