Grading Policies

Grade Categories

Summative -

70% of the final grade (ie. performances, individual assessments)

Formative -

30% of the final grade (ie. Checks for Understanding,

Classwork).

Retake Policy

Students can retake a summative assessment with the highest score of an 85% on the retake. They must complete a <u>retake request</u>, have no missing work, and complete additional learning opportunities to prepare for the retake.

Late Work Policy

Late work will be accepted for credit, up until the review day of a unit or chapter, or a test retake. Once the review and assessment is complete, no late work will be accepted and the student will receive a zero.

Absent Work Policy

The general rule is that students have 1 extra day to make up the work from an absence, and they need to communicate with their teacher. Extended absences will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
